Mr Toad has been practising his bird spotting. Can you help him find out more about the wonderful birds that live all around us?

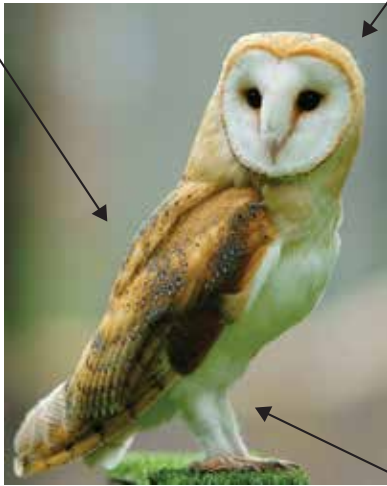
All animals are adapted to live in their environment. Birds of prey are adapted to help them hunt for their food.

Look at how the Barn Owl is adapted to hunt. Compare it to a bird you can see and describe this bird in the box below. It might not be a bird of prey.

Bird of Prey: Barn Owl

Big wings with soft feathers help the owl to fly quietly.

Hooked beak to help the owl grip its prey.



Long toes with sharp talons to help catch prey.

Long legs to reach into grass when hunting.
