The River & Rowing Museum is painting stones and rocks to celebrate the beloved story of *The Wind in the Willows* by Kenneth Grahame.

You could paint a character from the books or a scene with a river and the willow trees. It's really up to you.

When working with stones we would recommend painting a white base onto them before applying other colours. This gives you a blank canvas to work with.



Use the painted stones as a paper weight indoors or, if you'd like to keep them outdoors, don't forget to varnish or seal them with a waterproof gloss or sealant.



Paint and felt tips work best to decorate stones.
